

## 2017-18 New California Charter Schools Fact Sheet

### California Charter Schools Serve 630,000 Students

The California Charter Schools Association (CCSA) announced that an estimated 630,000 students are enrolled in 1,275 charter public schools across the state for the 2017-18 school year. This year 65 new school equivalents opened in California. This includes 56 new startups and replications, as well as nine planned significant expansions of existing schools (such as a K-5 elementary school adding the equivalent of a new middle school by expanding to grades 6-8).

Charter enrollment grew by an estimated 27,000 students, or 4.5%. This year, the Los Angeles region had the largest charter school growth (18 new charters opening). The second largest growth area is the Bay Area region (11 new charters).

An additional 11 schools opened as a result of the [Anderson Union HSD v Shasta ruling](#). The case impacted nonclassroom-based charter schools operating resource centers outside of the school district in which it is authorized but within the same county. CCSA is not including them in its new school totals since most were in existence last year as resource centers

### By the Numbers

- **1,275:** Total number of charter schools existing in California.
  - **65:** Number of new charter school equivalents opening in 2017-18 school year. Of these, 56 were new startups and replications and nine were planned significant expansions of existing schools.
  - **11:** Additional schools opened as a result of the Shasta ruling (previously resource centers).
  - **California:** State with the most charter schools and students anywhere in the country.
  - **630,000:** Estimated number of students attending charters statewide as of 2017-18.
  - **27,000:** Estimated student growth in charter schools in 2017-18.
  - **Los Angeles:** Region with highest growth in new charter schools.
  - **18:** Number of charters opening in Los Angeles region.
  - **Bay Area:** Region with second highest growth in CA, with 11 new charter schools opening.
  - **46:** Number of schools that closed in 2016-17.
- California approved the Charter Schools Act in 1992.
  - California was the second state in the nation to pass a charter school law—after Minnesota.
  - California has the most charter schools and charter school students in the U.S.
